December 21, 1999: Winners are chosen for the *Good Tidings Contest*, to which MPR invited listeners to submit original, seasonal greetings, toasts, and poems, to be read on the air throughout the second half of the month.

December 17, 1999: Echoes of Christmas concert by the Dale Warland Singers, including traditional carols and carols written in Minnesota

December 19, 1999: The annual Welcome Christmas concert is presented by the Plymouth Music Series of Minneapolis

December 21, 1999: Classics Du Jour presents a special broadcast of Handel's *Messiah* by the Minnesota Orchestra and Minnesota Chorale

December 22-25, 1999: Minnesota Public Radio presents a four-day festival of holiday music.

December 24, 1999: MPR airs the annual *Nine Lessons and Carols* live broadcast from Cambridge, England, King's College Choir, which was repeated December 25, 1999.

December 24, 1999: MPR airs the live broadcast of the Midnight Mass from St. John's Abbey in Collegeville, MN.

December 31, 1999: MPR produces a New Year's Eve special including performances by local musicians and telephone conversations with broadcasters in many countries.
