Dear Ms Dortch:

On January 31, 2003, in accordance with 47 CFR 73.561 (d), Minnesota Public Radio ("MPR"), licensee of WGGL -FM, Houghton, MI, informed the Commission that MPR had temporarily begun operating WGGL FM at reduced power since January 24, 2003 due to failure of a power supply transformer.

A replacement transformer has been put into place, but the transmitter still is not working properly and we are not certain why this is happening. The transmitter site is in a forest in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan and is accessible during the winter only by snowmobile, so repairs to the transmitter site are difficult.

Since the replacement power supply transformer was installed, MPR has been operating the station at about 4% of its authorized power. We anticipated that due in part to the difficulty of reaching the site, the station may not be up to its authorized power until spring, 2003.

Under the circumstances, MPR respectfully requests Special Temporary Authority pursuant to 47 CFR 73.1635 to operate WGGL at less than authorized power for the next six (6) months.

An Anti-Drug Abuse Act certification form is attached. MPR is a noncommercial educational licensee, therefore, no fee is required for this filing.
