Minnesota Public Radio ("MPR"), holder of construction permits for WMLS-FM, Grand Marais, MN, and for WLSN-FM, Grand Marais, MN (the "Stations"), filed applications for licenses to operate these stations on April 11, 2002. Despite numerous problems at the time the Stations initially went on the air, we have been operating the stations at full power since July, 2003, but lately we have been causing intermittent interference to TV translator receive antenna which is locate on the same tower as the Stations. Our current belief is that the problem is due to tower leg bonding issues.

Since mid January, 2004, MPR has been operating the Stations at approximately 10% of authorized power. We are actively working on solving the problem; however, we expect the Stations to continue to operate at less than full power for the foreseeable future.

MPR therefore respectfully requests Special Temporary Authority to operate the Stations at substantially reduced power for six (6) months.

Because MPR is a noncommercial, educational licensee, no filing fee is required with this request. An Anti-Drug Abuse Act Certification form is attached.
