Dear Ms Salas:

By letter filed with the Commission on April 13, 1999, Minnesota Public Radio ("MPR"), the licensee of WSCN(FM), Cloquet, Minnesota (the "Station"), notified the Commission that the station had gone off the air on April 3, 1999 as the result of damage sustained by a severe ice storm. Subsequently, on April 14, 1999, MPR notified the Commission that on April 13, 1999, the Station commenced operation with an emergency antenna pursuant to Section 73.1680 of the Commission's rules and requested special temporary authority to continue operations from the emergency antenna (the "STA Request").

MPR, by its undersigned counsel, hereby supplements the STA Request to inform the Commission that the Station's licensed antenna and tower have now been partially repaired and braced. On June 12, 1999 the Station returned to its licensed antenna and tower and is currently operating at 65% of its authorized power. It is expected that the tower owner will construct a new tower adjacent to the damaged tower this summer and then dismantle the damaged tower. MPR thus anticipates that the Station will eventually be moved to the new tower and then returned to full power. Accordingly, MPR revises its request for special temporary authority to seek authorization to continue to operate its licensed facilities at reduced power until such time as the Station can be restored to full power.
